WELCOME

Welcome to our 2021 Edition of Along the River! This annual publication helps keep our visitors up to date on recreational and educational opportunities in the Rock Island District's Mississippi River Project. We'd like to reflect on 2020 and acknowledge the unique, challenging, and unexpected ways it affected our recreation areas.



COVID-19 has impacted people across the globe in one way or another and our Project was no different. Many of our recreation areas experienced delayed openings to ensure proper safety procedures were in place. When recreation areas were able to open, visitors noticed a few changes early on, such as: all reservations were made online or using a phone app, tours and interpretive programs were cancelled, and Rangers and park attendants had to limit fee collection.

Some of these necessary changes worked well for our district and have carried through into the new year. Fees will continue to be collected either online or

through into the new year. Fees whit through newly installed fee machines at most of our day use and camping areas. (For more information on these updates, see page 8.) This will hopefully allow fee attendants and park rangers more flexibility and time to better address safety and maintenance issues. More changes coming to some of our recreation areas include the installation of a new restroom and shower facility at Clark's Ferry Campground. In addition, new vault toilets will replace aging



new valit tollets will replace aging infrastructure at Lock and Dam 18, Lock and Dam 21, John Hay Day Use Area and Shady Creek Campground. A new overlook platform will be installed at Lock 18 to allow visitors to view locking of vessels and wildlife viewing. We hope these additions will enhance your experiences at these sites!

The Mighty Mississippi River was tame compared to the historic 2019 flood season. Our recreation areas stayed relatively dry, additional flood cleanup from the previous year was continued, and other natural resource work was coming along nicely in the early summer. Then, August brought a weather event many of us had never experienced or heard of- a "derecho". This was a widespread, straight-line windstorm that swept across a large part of the Midwest, bringing with it 70 - 120 mph winds. Although it blew through quickly, it left damage to communities that took weeks, sometimes months, to repair. Our recreation areas were largely spared major structure damage and personal injury but like everywhere else, there was major damage to trees, leaving hazards that we are still cleaning up in early 2021.

Despite COVID-19 restrictions, lockdowns, and the derecho, we saw a noticeable increase in visitation at our campgrounds and other recreation areas. Many of our day use areas were packed with people fishing and picnicking; boat ramps were full (and free for use) for most of the season. Campgrounds were filled nearly every weekend. Other areas throughout the country saw a similar increase in outdoor recreation as well. When folks were tired of being home and had limited recreation options, a return to nature seemed to be in order. Rangers were equally excited to greet new visitors and welcome back returning ones.

We appreciate all our visitors' support and understanding throughout this latest challenging year. We'll continue to do our best to provide you with great recreational opportunities in 2021!

To make your reservations online, go to: www.Recreation.gov.

What you will need to make a Reservation

Most Corps campsites are available through the www.Recreation.gov system. Reservations can be made up to 180 days in advance. You will need to give the following information to make a reservation:

- The campground name and the lake/river the campground is on.
- The campsite number (if you have one) or type of site desired.
- Arrival and departure dates for your camping stay.
- Your name, address, phone number and email address.
- Vehicles, trailers, tents and other equipment you will be bringing.
- License numbers of all of the vehicles you will be bringing.
- Senior (Golden Age), Access (Golden Access), or other America the Beautiful Interagency Pass number (if you have one).
- Credit card number to pay for your camping stay.

Reserving A Picnic Shelter

Select picnic shelters are reservable at many Corps of Engineers recreation areas. They are perfect for birthday parties, family reunions or other special occasions. The cost to reserve these sites is \$25 per day. Reservable shelters are located at Grant River, Blanding Landing, Thomson Causeway, Locks & Dam 14, Clark's Ferry and Shady Creek.

Contact a ranger station or visit www.Recreation. gov to reserve your picnic shelter today. See page 24 for more information on the amenities available at each shelter.



MISSISSIPPI RIVER PROJECT CAMPGROUND RULES

- ALL persons with campsite reservations must check in with park attendant. See individual campground pages for fee booth hours.
- 2. Camping at one or more campsites is limited to 14 days during any 30 consecutive day period.
- 3. Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Pets must be on a leash no longer than six feet, picked up after, and controlled at all times. Pets are not allowed in shower building.
- Parking on grass and roadsides is prohibited. Vehicles must be parked on campsite or in designated parking areas. Two vehicles are allowed per campsite. Parking on vacant campsites is prohibited.
- Hooking up to water, except to fill up your tank, is prohibited. No hose washing of campers is allowed. Utilizing a "T' or "Y" attachment is not allowed.
- Campsite must be occupied daily. Equipment left unattended longer than 24 hours will be impounded and removed at owner's expense.

- 8. One family per campsite or a maximum of six persons per site is allowed.
- 9. Camping equipment is limited to 1 wheeled unit plus 1 tent per site, or 2 tents per site.
- 10. Check out time is 4 p.m.
- No trash allowed in fire rings, to include but not limited to treated lumber and construction material. No moving of fire rings.
- 12. No garbage/trash may be removed from campground dumpsters/trash receptacles.
- No Solicitation. Removable "For Sale" signs on cars, campers, or any other equipment located in the recreation area is not allowed and needs to be removed upon entry.
- 14. All state bicycle laws apply. No riding bicycles after dark, unless equipped with headlights and tail lights and rules of the road are being followed.
- No electric/gas powered vehicles that are not state registered. This is to include electric bikes, scooters, golf carts, etc.

WITH THE CORPS OF ENGINEERS

Camping along the Mississippi River offers fantastic river views, outstanding service and great facilities. We want to make your camping experience the best it has ever been! This article outlines how to register for a campsite and a few tips to help you along the way.

2021 Class A Campground Fees

Overnight camping fees for Class A campgrounds are \$14 for non-electric and \$20 for electric sites. All Class A campgrounds are reservable. Discount passes, such as the America the Beautiful Interagency passes, will continue to be accepted.

Class A Campground Information Season Dates and Fee Booth Hours

- These areas include Grant River, Thomson Causeway, Fisherman's Corner North, Clark's Ferry, and Shady Creek. Class A campground season dates are May 1 through the fourth Sunday of October; all fee booths are open during this time. For fee booth hours at each site, see specific campground pages in this booklet.
- When you arrive at a reservable campground: If you have a reservation, set up your equipment and check in at the fee booth when it opens. If you do not have a reservation, call 877-444-6777 or check the www.Recreation. gov website to find out what sites are available and make a reservation.
- How can I tell if a site I want is reserved or occupied? Campsites that are reserved will have a yellow tag with the dates of the impending reservation. Campsites that are already occupied will have a white tag on the post with their departure date and are considered occupied until 4 p.m. on that date. Phone operators at 877-444-6777 or the Recreation. gov website will also have this information.
- If you find a site that is not reserved or occupied for any part of your stay: Reserve the site by calling 877-444-6777 or through www.Recreation. gov and follow instructions to pay

for your stay. Set up your equipment and begin camping. Check in with the campground fee attendant during their operating hours.

How do I reserve a campsite for a future date? If you want a campsite for future occupancy, please make a reservation by calling 877-444-6777 or visit www.Recreation.gov. Reservations can be made up to 180 days in advance of your arrival date.

Camping in the Offseason

Some campgrounds remain open in a limited capacity in the offseason. Camping is primitive and no amenities, such as power and water, are available. Camping is free in the offseason, but all campground rules still apply. Check campgrounds within this booklet to see which ones are open year-round.

We strongly recommend making a reservation prior to camping at any of the Class A parks along the Mississippi River. This will ensure you a campsite for the dates of your choice and you can choose your favorite site. We look forward to seeing you camping along the Mississippi River with the Corps of Engineers!

CAMPING ALONG THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER

2021 Class B Campground Fees

Most Class B campgrounds are \$12 per night per site, except for Blanding Landing. Blanding Landing offers electric sites for \$20 and non-electric sites for \$14 per night.

All Class B campgrounds are first come, first served. Most will now require a credit/debit card; Bulger's Hollow is the ONLY campground where cash is accepted. Discount passes, such as the America the Beautiful Interagency passes, will continue to be accepted.

Class B Campground Information Season Dates

These areas include Blanding Landing, Pleasant Creek, Bulger's Hollow, and Blanchard Island. Class B campgrounds are typically open May 15 through October 15.

When you arrive at the campground: Find a site that is unoccupied and set up your equipment. Return to the campground's fee machine, QR Code kiosk, or honor vault to complete your registration.

Blanding Landing and Pleasant Creek Campgrounds now feature a fee machine, found near the front of each campground. When you have located the fee machine, follow the prompts on the screen to pay for your campsite using a credit/debit card.

Bulger's Hollow Campground has a selfregistration process in which you locate the kiosk near the front of the campground, fill out a registration envelope and place your cash payment in it. Place the tear-off portion of the envelope on your site post. Deposit the sealed envelope in the honor vault.

Blanchard Island Campground is the test site for a new QR Code registration utilizing the www.Recreation.gov Smartphone (iOS and Android) App. You must download this app and create an account, if you don't already have one, PRIOR to your arrival at the campground.

- What is a QR Code? A QR Code is essentially a type of bar code that can be used to link to a website or feature using your smartphone. The following is an example of what one may look like:
- Once you've found an empty site and set up your equipment, return to the information kiosk near the front of the campground. Use the www.Recreation. gov App to scan the QR Code, which will prompt you to a checkout screen. You will then follow the instructions on the screen to use a credit/debit card to pay for the length of your stay.
- After you have paid and received your confirmation number, fill out the receipt tag portion of a registration envelope and place the tag on your site post.
- How can I tell if a site I want is occupied? Class B Campgrounds are first come, first served only. If a site has no equipment on it after the 4 p.m. checkout time, you may set up your equipment and claim the site.



VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITIES

Volunteers play an important role in protecting natural resources by helping to operate and maintain recreation facilities at the US Army Corps of Engineers Mississippi River Project. The Mississippi River Project offers a variety of opportunities to volunteers looking to donate their time. Volunteers can be found greeting people and presenting programs at the Mississippi River Visitor Center, Volunteers may perform some grounds and maintenance work at campgrounds, collect fees, or help with office administration work. Whatever the task may be, volunteers help accomplish work that might otherwise not be completed. Volunteering can be long term, seasonal or a one-time event. Long term and seasonal volunteers are required to work a minimum of 21 hours a week, but can



work more if interested. Oftentimes these volunteers will be provided a free camp site with basic amenities at one of our parks and at the end of the season may qualify for receiving an America the Beautiful Interagency Volunteer Pass. AMERICA THE BEAUTIFUL

INTERAGENCY PASS PROGRAM

The America the Beautiful Interagency Pass Program is a suite of annual and lifetime passes that provides U.S. citizens and visitors an affordable and convenient way to access Federal recreation lands and waters.

Federal agencies that participate in this program include: the Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, Fish and Wildlife Service, USDA Forest Service, National Park Service and US Army Corps of Engineers. Please note that passes are non-transferable and the pass holder must be present to use one.

What passes are included and what are the requirements?

 Lifetime Senior Pass - Cost: \$80
 US Citizens or permanent residents age 62 and older can purchase. Valid for the life time of the pass holder.



- Annual Senior Pass Cost: \$20 US Citizens or permanent residents age 62 and older can purchase. Valid for 1 year from the month of issue. These can be upgraded to a Lifetime Senior Pass. Present previously purchased Annual Senior Passes and pay the difference between the combined price of these passes and the \$80 purchase price of the Lifetime Senior Pass.
- Access Pass Cost: Free US Citizens or permanent residents with documentation of a permanent disability. Valid for the lifetime of the pass holder.
- Annual Pass Cost: \$80 Any US Citizen or permanent resident 16 years and older can purchase. Valid for 1 year from the month of issue.

- Volunteer Pass Cost: Free Must have completed 250+ hours of volunteer service on public lands. Valid for 1 year from the month of issue.
- Annual Military Pass Cost: Free For all active military members and their dependents. Valid for 1 year from the month of issue.
- Veterans and Gold Star Family Pass Cost: Free For all military veterans and Gold Star Family members. Valid for the lifetime of the pass holder.



Every Kid Outdoors Pass - Cost: Free Any 4th grade student. Valid the duration of the 4th grade school year through the following summer (September - August). Visit www.everykidoutdoors.gov.

What do the passes cover?

These passes cover entrance, access or standard amenity fees to more than 2,000 Federal recreation sites. Senior and Access Passes also provide a discount on some expanded amenity fees such as camping and boat ramp fees.

Are the Golden Age and Golden Access Passes still valid?

Yes, both are still accepted and can be exchanged for the updated Senior or Access Passes.


Where can I buy these passes?

Some passes may be available at campground fee booths during operating hours. Check your nearby campground fee booth hours and contact information in this booklet. Several other federal agencies and their sites also issue passes.

Where can I find more information?

You can find more information by visiting the website https://store.usgs. gov/pass, talking to a park ranger, or calling the Mississippi River Visitor Center at 309-794-5338.

The Grant River Recreation Area is known for its beautiful views of the Mississippi River and fantastic sunsets. It is located two miles south of Potosi, Wisconsin, off Highway 133. 

Fishing Opportunities

Grant River is located along Pool 11 of the Mississippi River. Around the park and the town of Potosi, the river is a broad expanse of open water. Potosi, Wisconsin, is known as "The Catfish Capitol of Wisconsin." Channel catfish are very abundant along the shorelines of the Mississippi and especially so in this area. Another great fishing spot is Potosi Point just upriver from the park. There you can launch a boat in deeper waters or fish from shore.

For a more productive fishing experience, visit the kiosk located inside the recreation area by the boat ramp. There, you can learn about the many types of local fish and the types of bait to catch them. Those launching boats on the river are invited to take a free river pool map located at the fee booth.

Blanding Landing is located along Pool 12 of the Mississippi River. Pool 12 has islands, side channels and backwaters throughout most of its length, and the major species of fish are bluegill, channel catfish, crappie, freshwater drum, largemouth bass, sauger, walleye and white bass.

Shoreline fishing in the park is challenging, but just outside the park and upriver towards Chestnut Mountain are a few hidden spots along the shoreline that the locals enjoy. The nearest bait/tackle shop is at least 20 minutes away. Those launching boats

on the river are invited to take a free river pool map located at the fee booth.

is rustic and relaxing with prime views of the Mississippi River. It is located 3 miles south of Bellevue, Iowa, along Highway 52. The recreation area has 27 first-come, first-served campsites, drinking water and vault toliets in the campground. There is also a sewer dump station and a concrete boat ramp with direct access to the main river channel. There is no electrical service or flush toilets, making this a perfect spot for primitive campers. Visitors can walk in the island section which can be accessed from a bridge near the entrance and another bridge closer to the campground.




FISHING OPPORTUNITIES

Pleasant Creek offers anglers a variety of fishing opportunities. Perch, catfish, rock bass, walleye, and crappie are just a few varieties of fish you can expect to catch along the Mississippi River.

By boat, you can travel just a short way upriver to fish along a wing dam or downstream of Lock & Dam 12 in Bellevue. You can also head downriver from the park to one of the many backwater sloughs. Before you head out on the water, check with the campground host for a free river pool map. For campers that don't have access to a vessel, fishing along the shoreline still offers plenty of success and relaxation.




Thomson Causeway Recreation Area offers



THOMSON CAUSEWAY RECREATION AREA






FISHING OPPORTUNITIES

There are ample fishing opportunities when visiting Thomson Causeway and Pool 13. You can spend an afternoon shoreline fishing in the campground or use one of the local boat ramps that access the backwaters of the Mississippi River. While fishing in the area you will have the opportunity to angle for a wide variety of species, including catfish, largemouth bass, crappie and blue gill sunfish. More experienced fisherman can try for the big prizes — northern pike and walleye.

This area, as well as nearby Spring Lake, is a mecca for local fishing tournaments all season long. Fishing in the area continues even through the



winter; Potter's Marsh and Spring Lake are both popular ice fishing destinations.



If you are looking for a few nights of good old fashioned camping, then Bulger's Hollow Recreation Area is your stop. With 23 non-reservable campsites, 17 RV sites and nine tent camping sites, this park is small in size but offers one of the best views of the Mississippi. This campground offers primitive amenities, such as drinking water, vault toilets, and a dump station. As a reminder, campers have a 14-day camping limit, within a 30-day period. The camping area is open from May 15-October 15. The boat ramp and day use areas are open year-round. Camping is not the only attraction to the area. Bulger's Hollow also offers a boat ramp, playground equipment and picnic


sites for a great way to spend an afternoon with the family.


Fishing Opportunities







In early spring and late fall, boaters will flock below the dam to position themselves for prime walleye fishing. River Visitor Center, which overlooks Locks & Dam 15 on Arsenal Island in Rock Island, Illinois. Locks & Dam 15, built between 1931 and 1934, was the first of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers dams built as part of the 9-Foot Channel Project. It is now one of 29 dams to make a stairway of water stretching from St. Paul, Minnesota to St. Louis, Missouri. These dams help deepen the waterway to maintain a 9-foot navigation channel for commercial towboats transporting goods along the Upper Mississippi River.

A glassed exterior wall and observation deck on the second floor of this ADA accessible Visitor Center provide exceptional views of towboats and other vessels passing through the locks. Park Rangers and volunteers are available to answer any questions. In addition, the facility offers educational displays including a river floor map, an aguarium with native Mississippi River fish, and information about Army Corps of Engineers mission and operations. A small movie theater has a variety of informational films for all ages.

The Visitor Center gift shop will accommodate all of your souvenir needs with a range of T-shirts, books, kids' gifts, and other items. For those travelling on local waterways or simply wanting to learn more about the rivers' flows, Upper Mississippi River and Illinois Waterway Navigation Charts are also available for purchase.

Park Rangers and volunteers offer guided tours of Locks & Dam 15 on Saturdays and Sundays from Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day Weekend at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Space is limited and reservations are highly recommended. Special tours may also be arranged at other times for schools, families or organizational groups. These groups must call ahead to schedule a tour at least 30 days in advance of their arrival date. Outdoor tours are dependent on weather conditions.

The Mississippi River Visitor Center has a wide range of interpretive programs available to visitors both on- and off-site. Some popular programs include: Water Safety, Mammals, Bald Eagles, and Life on a Towboat. Park Rangers present these programs at schools and other facilities by request. Contact Visitor Center staff to learn more about these opportunities.

Accessing the Rock Island Arsenal

Visitors to Locks & Dam 15 and other Rock Island Arsenal facilities will need to receive a Visitor Pass from the Visitor Control Center at the Moline Gate. Once you have completed this process, you can request a map and directions to our

U.S. Citizens age 18 and older will need to present a valid picture ID and pass a quick background check. Some visitors may be required to provide additional documentation.

Previously acquired, unexpired Visitor Passes may be used at any of the three entrance gates (Moline, Rock Island, and Davenport) during their operating hours.





Clark's Ferry Recreation Area is a popular 11-acre park just off Highway 22 along the Mississippi River in Montpelier, lowa, halfway between the Quad Cities and Muscatine.

The Class A campground has 45 concrete sites all featuring 30 and 50 amp electrical service and many have great views of the river. Most of the campsites can accommodate large RVs and offer wide grassy spaces between sites. Showers, running water, and flush toilets are also available. Large, mature trees shade the campground and provide a relaxing atmosphere that many campers seek.

The day use area provides a reservable picnic shelter, playground, and horseshoe pit, which are all accessible year-round. The boat ramp is also open year round, but a fee is only charged for launching from May 1 through the 4th Sunday in October.

Occasional ranger programs and other special events take place in the recreation area during the camping season. Information on these can be found on campground bulletin boards or by calling the Muscatine Ranger Station at 563-263-7913.

Developed For those looking for a river access or secluded campsite, we offer several opportunities. Our river access only areas have a boat ramp, parking for your vehicle and often a vault toilet but no camping is allowed at these sites. Our camping and river access areas offer a primitive camping option as well as access to the river. Most of these camping areas offer semi-developed campsites, vault toilets, drinking water, boat launches and picnic areas for your enjoyment.

- Big Slough* located four miles north of Thomson, Illinois, 1/2 mile west off Highway 84 at river mile 531.4 offers developed river access, courtesy dock and is a great fishing hotspot.
- Cattail Slough* sits in the backwaters of the Mississippi at river mile 517.8. It is located 1/4 mile southwest of Fulton, Illinois, off Highway 84 and offers excellent fishing with river access and courtesy dock.
- Lock & Dam 13 offers river access and great bank fishing. It is located three miles north of Fulton, Illinois, off Highway 84 at river mile 522.5 and has a picnic shelter, and vault toilets. A river observation deck/ restroom building also overlooks the lock and dam.

- Locks & Dam 14/Smith's Island located just down river of LeClaire. Iowa, off Highway 67 at river mile 493.3 offers a one mile hiking trail. bank fishing and wildlife/riverboat watching. The area also has a reservable picnic shelter and vault toilets available for public use.
- Andalusia Slough is a popular river access point. It is located two miles west of Andalusia, Illinois, off Highway 92 at river mile 470.
- Kilpeck Landing is a popular boat ramp and offers river access for prime fishing spots. It is located five miles northeast of Grandview, Iowa, at river mile 446.7.
- Fenway Landing offers river access and is located 4 miles north of Canton, Missouri on Highway 61 at river mile 347.8.
- Canton Chute is a recreation area with the closest river access to Hogback Island, located off of N. Bottom Road, north of Quincy, Illinois, at river mile 331.6.
- John Hay located across the river from Hannibal, Missouri, on Highway 106 near East Hannibal, Illinois, at river mile 309.3 offers a day use facility with river access.

- Park-N-Fish located southwest of Hull, Illinois, off Highway 106 at river mile 301.2 offers bank fishing along the spillway of Lock & Dam 22.

- Ferry Landing sits at the mouth of the Iowa River, near the northern edge of Oakville, Iowa at river mile 433.6 and offers river access.

Camping & River Access:

Bear Creek located off Highway 96 near Marcelline, Illinois, at river mile 340.9 offers seasonal camping and river access. The dates for seasonal camping are from September 1 to December 31. Hunting is permitted on the Long Island Division of the Great River National Wildlife Refuge surrounding the campground.

Tours are typically an hour in length and visitors should be prepared to walk or stand this entire time.


Visitors are asked to wear low-heeled, closetoed shoes with a back. No cameras, recording devices, bags, or backpacks are allowed on tours. Group sizes may be limited, so it's recommended to make reservations. Below are dates, times, and requirements for specific viewing locations and tours.

RECREATION DAY USE FEE PROGRAM – BOAT RAMPS



Some boat ramps along the Mississippi River require a user fee as part of the Corps of Engineers Recreation Day Use Fee Program. Day use fees help recover only a portion of costs associated with operating and maintaining Corps' recreation facilities. Boat ramp fees are charged annually from May 1 through the 4th Sunday of October.

For daily use, there is a \$5 fee. Grant River, Cattail Slough, Clark's Ferry, and Shady Creek Recreation Areas utilize a self-registration cash vault. For these ramps, use these simple steps:

- Fill out information required on envelope
- Insert payment into the envelope. Payment can be made using cash or check made out to FAO, USAED, Rock Island
- Tear off the hang-tag portion, date, and hang the tag on your rear-view mirror with the date visible from the outside of the vehicle.
- Seal the envelope and deposit it in the vault.

Blanding Landing, Pleasant Creek, and Big Slough utilize a selfregistration fee machine. For these ramps, use these simple steps: Locate fee machine and follow directions on screen to pay by credit/debit card

Place printed recipt on driver's side of dashboard with date clearly visible.

*Note: Day use fees are valid for the entire date of purchase. Permits may be used to launch from other Corps of Engineers ramps on the same day as long as the hang tag is dated and displayed properly.

If you are a frequent visitor, you may wish to purchase an annual pass for \$40. The annual pass allows unlimited, nationwide use of all Corps day use fee areas for one year from date of purchase. The pass is in the form of a placard that hangs on your rearview mirror.

If you have a Senior/Access Interagency Pass, you will no longer need to purchase a USACE Annual Pass for day use fee areas. All you will need to do is display your Senior/Access Interagency Pass in your vehicle either on the dash or by using a hang tag. Hang tags will be available at USACE offices. More information on the America the Beautiful Interagency Pass Program can be found on page 10. If you are staying at a Corps of Engineers campground you do not have to pay the daily fee for use of the boat

ramp. Place your current camping receipt on your vehicle dash with the camping dates visible.

Boat ramps that charge a use fee on the Mississippi River are: Grant River, Blanding Landing, Pleasant Creek, Big Slough, Cattail Slough, Clark's Ferry and Shady Creek Recreation Area. •

ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP MISSION





As you may be aware, the Mississippi River is a globally significant natural resource. However, you may not know it was designated a Globally Important Bird Area in 2001 by the American Bird Conservancy and a Wetland of International Importance in 2010 during the International Ramsar Convention. The Mississippi River Project is working to support this resource in part through our Environmental Stewardship mission with our Forestry and Shoreline Management programs.

Our Forestry Program, the oldest within the Corps of Engineers and second largest in size, originated in 1941 in support of the WWII war efforts. Our managed lands cover 54,000 acres of land and over 2,000 miles of shoreline along the river. 2021 marks the 41st year that we met with our partner state and federal fish and wildlife agencies to cooperatively manage the forested resource. Over 80 percent is leased to other state and federal agencies such as the Fish and





Wildlife Service and Department of Natural Resources for wildlife refuges and management areas through cooperative agreements though the Corps maintains timber rights on the trees. All forest management activities are aligned with the wildlife goals of our partner agencies and include timber harvests to promote diversity of tree size and tree regeneration, timber stand improvement to promote health of diverse tree species, and tree planting to help maintain the presence of diverse tree stands.

The Shoreline Management Program provides access opportunities for water-based recreation while helping to protect the shoreline and wildlife habitat. This program allows for placement of docks and associated structures on federal lands in designated areas and protects shoreline in other environmentally sensitive areas.

MISSISSIPPI RIVER WATER SAFETY

The Mississippi River provides many exciting opportunities for recreational activities such as boating, fishing and hunting. Whatever your hobby of choice happens to be, keeping water safety in mind and coming home at the end of the day should always be a priority. Wearing life jackets is one of the easiest and most effective ways to stay safe.

If you are new to boating or want to brush up on your boat skills, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources partners with other agencies to offer Boat Safety Classes. Students who successfully complete the class will earn an Illinois Boat Safety Card. Only one 8-hour class is required to complete your certification.

Sizes run from infant to extra extra large. Adult life jackets will not work for children until they weigh about 90 pounds. Children's life jackets should have a loop on the collar and a strap between the legs.

CHECK FOR PROPER FIT

- Lift the shoulders of the life jacket.
- Make sure it does not slip above the chin or ears.
- It should feel snug, yet comfortable. A properly fitted life jacket keeps your head and shoulders above water. You will be able to swim with it, too.

FASTEN UP

Fasten up all buckles, zippers and straps. Adjust straps so that the jacket fits snugly.

WEAR IT!

A life jacket only works if it's worn. Take the time to be prepared. Make sure you have and wear the right life jacket before you go out in the water.
